

## HEADLAND PARK AND NORTHERN COVE CHRONOLOGY (SUMMARY)

<b>2005</b>	<b>International Urban Design Competition Stage 1</b>
July	137 entries – 5 schemes selected
<b>2006</b>	<b>Urban Design Competition Stage 2</b>
March	<p>Hill Thalys Architecture + Urban Projects, Paul Berkemeier Architects and Jane Irwin Landscape Architecture selected as the winning scheme. In developing the scheme beyond its current concept the Jury recommended that the following elements be integrated in the next phase of the project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· A natural headland form which touches the water at the northern end of the site</li> <li>· A large northern cove located directly behind the headland to further define the headland</li> <li>· A larger intervention of the southern cove located north of Napoleon Street</li> </ul>

February	<p><b>B1. Public Domain – Northern Headland</b></p> <p>1. Noting the jury report recommendations on the competition winning design scheme, further detailed design plans for the northern headland are to be provided</p> <p>2. The plan identified in (1) above are to address the following requirements and objectives: (only point a is included – determination includes points a, b, c, d, e, f)</p> <p><i>(a) the reinstatement of a headland at the northern end of the site with a naturalised shape and form including a build up of height and a generous landscaped connection to physically link Clynne Reserve, to allow direct pedestrian access from Argyle Place and appreciation of the landform of the former headland</i></p>
	<p><b>B2. Public Domain – Northern Cove</b></p> <p>1. Noting the jury report recommendations on the competition winning design scheme, further detailed design plans for the Northern Cove located opposite Munn Street are to be provided.</p> <p>2. The plans identified in (1) above are to address the following requirements and objectives:</p> <p>(a) an enlargement of the water intrusion</p> <p>(b) a greater naturalised shape, form and edges including treatment surrounding the cove</p>
