

## Pier Pavilion

---

A spectacular public landmark is coming. Pier Pavilion, located in Watermans Cove, will be a stunning public space where people can shelter, meet, gather and relax by the water. Infrastructure NSW has engaged Stephen Edwards Constructions (SEC) to deliver the works.

### Works update

Construction is progressing, with the green roof now fully installed. Services rough-in works for the Cella are mostly complete, in preparation for the terrazzo oyster concrete cladding. Installation of the terrazzo oyster concrete façade is ongoing. Externally, a mid-tier deck extension is complete, allowing for the installation of a new timber seat at the pier's end.

### Upcoming works

Over the coming weeks, SEC is:

- Commencing the internal wall sheeting and fitout process within the Cella.
  - Continuing ceiling framing works to the main Pavilion roof.
  - Continuing installation of the terrazzo oyster concrete cladding.
  - Installing the external timber seat.
  - Installing steel framing supports for the curved internal terrazzo oyster concrete seat.
  - Reticulating new submains to the Pavilion through existing pathways in the public domain area. Please see Submains reticulation, for more information.

### Submains reticulation

To support the new electrical services in the Pavilion, larger and upgraded submains need to be installed. SEC will carry out this work in the coming week. A backup generator will be onsite for all submain installation works as multiple electrical isolations will be required to facilitate the works.

From Monday 30 September, SEC will be undertaking cable haulage works. Similar to past setups, this work will involve barricaded exclusion zones and pedestrian diversions in the public domain. The exclusion zone will be in place all day Monday 30 September and for an estimated half-day on Tuesday 1 October, to facilitate the work. Exclusion zones will be removed and made safe at the end of each workday.

Additional works may need to be considered by SEC pending the outcomes of the cable haulage and this will be communicated with stakeholders in advance.

### What to expect

During electrical shutdowns there will be a low level of constant noise emitted from the site generator. Measures will be in place to make this as low impact as possible, including sound blankets and a low noise emission generator.

Generally, with the majority of the large construction materials delivered to site, the vast majority of deliveries moving forward will be small to medium sized rigid trucks. On a day-to-day basis these will be contained within SEC's site hoarding boundaries and will still be escorted through the public domain areas.

If oversized vehicle deliveries are required, an exclusion zone will be placed around the semi-trailer, marked by barriers. These zones will be in place for around 4-5 hours on the day of delivery and removed soon after. Large truck deliveries are expected to be minimal moving forward on the project.

During large deliveries, pedestrian movements will be diverted around the vehicle exclusion zone, and cyclists will be asked to dismount for a small section of Wulugul Walk. SEC will provide signage and traffic controllers as required to facilitate any necessary diversions.

Construction will continue to occur during standard City of Sydney construction hours, with an extended respite period from high noise emission appliances, detailed below. Other plant and machinery will continue during those hours.

Day	Hours of work
Monday to Friday	<b>7.30am - 5.30pm.</b> Respite period: High noise emission appliances*, plant and/or machinery will <b>not</b> be used between 12pm and 2pm.
Saturday	<b>7.30am - 3.30pm.</b> Respite period: High noise emission appliances*, plant and/or machinery will <b>not</b> be used before 9:30am or after 12pm.

\*High noise emission appliances include machinery such as piledrivers, rock breakers and hydraulic hammers.
