


## Pier Pavilion

A spectacular public landmark is coming. Pier Pavilion, located in Watermans Cove, will be a stunning public space where people can shelter, meet, gather and relax by the water. Infrastructure NSW has engaged Stephen Edwards Constructions (SEC) to deliver the works.

### Works update

Construction of the steel structure has progressed to 100%. The 'oculus' has been installed, completing the steel roof structure. The oculus is a feature of the design, located in the centre of the pavilion and will let sunlight into the space.

Scaffolding has been installed around the perimeter of the steel structure, in preparation of the upcoming roof works required to install a green roof on the pavilion.

### Upcoming works

In the next few weeks, SEC is:

- Erecting internal steelwork.
- Installing the roof waterproofing.
- Installing a medium sized mobile crane, to lift landscape material. The crane will be housed on-site within hoarding for approximately one week.
- Expecting semi-trailer deliveries of bagged soil and landscape materials for the rooftop garden.

# Barangaroo

- Commencing ceiling framing and terrazzo facade cladding.
- Expecting small rigid trucks with numerous facade panel deliveries.

## What to expect

During oversized truck deliveries, an exclusion zone will be placed around the semi-trailer, marked by barriers. These zones will be in place for around 4-5 hours on the day of delivery and removed soon after. Truck deliveries are expected around twice a week.

Pedestrian movements will continue to be diverted around the vehicle exclusion zone, and cyclists will be asked to dismount for a small section of Wulugul Walk. SEC will provide signage and traffic controllers will be onsite during certain times to assist.

## Working hours

Construction will continue to occur during standard City of Sydney construction hours, with an extended respite period from high noise emission appliances, detailed below. Other plant and machinery will continue during those hours.

Day	Hours of work
<b>Monday to Friday</b>	<b>7.30am - 5.30pm.</b> Respite period: High noise emission appliances*, plant and/or machinery will <b>not</b> be used between 12pm and 2pm.
<b>Saturday</b>	<b>7.30am - 3.30pm.</b> Respite period: High noise emission appliances*, plant and/or machinery will <b>not</b> be used before 9:30am or after 12pm.

\*High noise emission appliances include machinery such as piledrivers, rock breakers and hydraulic hammers.
