

Pier Pavilion

Pier Pavilion, located in Watermans Cove, will be a stunning public space where people can shelter, meet, gather and relax by the water. Infrastructure NSW has engaged Stephen Edwards Constructions (SEC) to deliver the works.

During VIVID Sydney (24 May to 15 June 2024), the site will close at 5:30pm on weekdays and 3.30pm on Saturdays.

Upcoming works

In the next few weeks, SEC is:

- Expecting further truck deliveries of structural steel
- Continuing to install the steel structure
- Expecting deliveries of Cross Laminated Timber (CLT) for the roof deck structure
- Installing the CLT roof deck.

Pedestrian movements will be diverted, and cyclists will be asked to dismount for a small section of Wulugul Walk. SEC will provide signage and traffic controllers will be onsite during certain times to assist.

What to expect

Activity	What to expect
Mobile crane on-site	<p>The large mobile crane will be established onsite for most of the steel erection period, for approximately 4 more weeks. It will then be removed from site and substituted with a smaller crane to finish the steel erection process.</p> <p>Additional small to medium sized mobile cranes will be brought in and out of site during the CLT installation process and landscaping roof works.</p>
Large vehicle deliveries Structural steel installation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Delivery of supporting equipment, including scissor lifts.• Mobile crane operations to install the steel columns and truss structure.• Large semi-trailer deliveries will occur once every two days during the steel erection period.• During steel deliveries, public exclusion zones will be setup around the perimeter hoarding. These exclusion zones will be in place for the duration of semi-trailer movements and unloading and then removed at the end of each day.• Pedestrians and cyclists will be detoured around the exclusion zone, marked by barriers. These zones will be in place for around 4-5 hours every second day.
CLT installation	<p>The CLT installation will follow the same process as the structural steel and take approximately 3 weeks. There will be public exclusion zones with deliveries every second or third day.</p>

Working hours

Construction will occur during standard City of Sydney construction hours, with an extended respite period from high noise works, detailed below.




Day	Hours of work
Monday to Friday	7.30am - 5.30pm. Respite period: High noise emission appliances*, plant and/or machinery will not be used between 12pm and 2pm.
Saturday	7.30am - 3.30pm. Respite period: High noise emission appliances*, plant and/or machinery will not be used before 9:30am or after 12pm.

*High noise emission appliances include machinery such as piledrivers, rock breakers and hydraulic hammers.
